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1. How and where do I apply for a burn permit?

Send an email to opswfpa@gmail.com at least 5 working days before you need the permit with the following information:

The name and contact details of the person who will conduct the burn, the location of the burn and the type of burn.

2. Where do I find out about training courses?

The WFPA website has a list with details on all the courses offered through the WFPA.

The WFPA will in its quarterly newsletter publish the dates available, prices for the training and dates by when bookings and payments need to be made.

3. What width should my fire break be and what method is the best for fire break preparation?

This is all included on the WFPA website as well as the WFPA rules which can be downloaded from the WFPA website.

4. What equipment should I buy?

Information can be found on the WFPA website as well as in the rules of the WFPA available for download from the WFPA website.

5. What does the fire preparedness checks and audits include?

The Fire Preparedness and FPA Compliance Checklist is a self-checklist which will also be used to spot audit members on compliance to the WFPA Rules. This list is available for download on the WFPA website.
